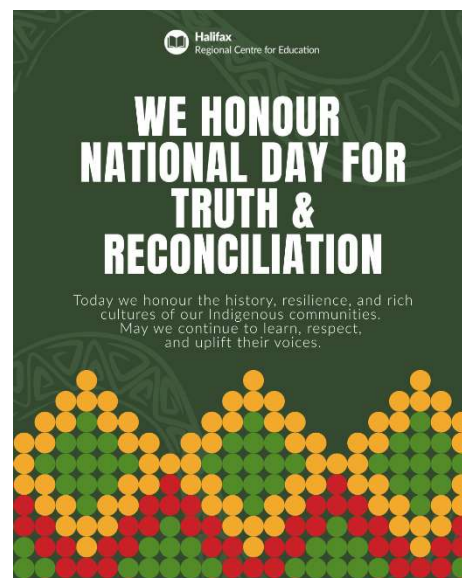


National Day for Truth & Reconciliation
